DIRECTIONS:

-Approaching from Colchester or Bury St Edmunds
follow the A14 over the Orwell Bridge then take the
2nd left onto the A12 towards Lowestoft. Crossover 5
roundabouts and at the 6th (by Wyevale Garden
Centre) turn right and continue down to the T-
junction. Turn right and Woodbridge School is
200yds on left.

-Approaching from Lowestoft on the A12 crossover
the roundabout that has Melton signed on the left.
Pass the Shell garage and at the next roundabout turn
left. Continue down to the T-junction. Turn right and
Woodbridge School is 200yds on the left.

-Once you get to the school follow signs to the
Sports Dome/Seckford Theatre. Car parking is
available as you arrive at the School, or near the
Sports Dome. Please do not park on the grass.

WOODBIDGE SCHOOL

Woodbridge School is an outstanding school academically and for sport, music, theatre and chess.

International Master Adam Hunt has, for many years, directed the development of chess at the school.

This term another International Master, Dagne Ciuksyte, stands in for Adam as the full-time chess coach.

They run a vast array of clubs, lessons and activities. The school has produced three England internationals and former student and chess scholar Justin Tan from Australia has also achieved the coveted International Master title.

SUFFOLK CHAMPIONSHIPS

Prizes will be awarded to the highest scoring Suffolk player in every age group from Under 8 to Under 18. This is based on their age at 31 August 2018. So, a 9-year-old on this date would be eligible the Under 10 prizes.

Please note, all players will play in one big open tournament, so good younger players may earn the opportunity to play older players.

RATE OF PLAY

15 minutes, plus ten seconds per move, per player per game. Clocks will be used on all boards. The games will be ECF rapidplay graded.

In the rare and unlikely event a game is not finished within an hour, the arbiter may ask the players to agree a result. If they do not agree, the arbiter may arbitrate. In this and all matters the arbiter's decision is final.

We encourage players to consider joining the English Chess Federation. Junior Silver Membership is free for the first year and allows a deduction of £1 from their entry fee for this tournament.

A variety of hot and cold refreshments will be available throughout the day. If you wish to bring your own food you are welcome to do so and Woodbridge town centre, with a range of cafes and restaurants is a ten-minute walk away.

HANDS UP!

If there are any questions, a player should put his hand up and may pause the clock and wait for an arbiter, if he believes the rules haven't been followed properly. It is generally not possible to retroactively make a judgement, after this point.

PARENTS

Parents are responsible for their own children throughout the day, although they should leave the playing area when the rounds start, so the players can concentrate fully.
